Carry out and complete clean-room cleaning operations



Overview

This standard is about conducting clean room cleaning operations. It includes the actions which should be taken whilst cleaning in the clean-room and those which should be taken afterwards in dealing with the waste and personal protective equipment (PPE)

Knowledge and understanding

Carry out clean-room cleaning operations

You need to know and understand:

- K1 where to get the information on how to select the appropriate equipment, tools and materials
- K2 why it is important to follow the manufacturers' instructions when you use the equipment, tools and materials and the consequences of not doing so
- K3 what action to take if a cleaning operation cannot be completed
- K4 what action to take if any damage or disruption occurs during the cleaning process and why is important to take this action

Remove and store equipment, tools and materials after clean-room cleaning operations

You need to know and understand:

- K5 why the equipment, tools and materials taken and used on the site of the cleaning operation should be removed from the clean-room
- K6 the types and locations of filtration systems on equipment
- K7 what action to take if any of the equipment, tools and materials are damaged or unserviceable and why it is important to take this action
- K8 why it is important to maintain stocks of materials, and at what level these stocks should be replenished
- K9 who to ask to confirm the correct storage location for the equipment, tools and materials

Remove and dispose of contaminated material after clean-room cleaning operations

You need to know and understand:

- K10 what personal protective equipment is required for the waste and contaminated material involved, where it can be obtained and why you should use it
- K11 the hazards associated with waste from cleaning operations in clean-
- K12 who to ask or where to find out what and where are the correct containers for the waste and contaminated material involved and why this is important
- K13 why it is important to handle and dispose of the waste and contaminated material safely according to current regulations and instructions
- K14 where to get information on current regulations and instructions
- K15 where the allocated collection point for waste containers is and how to make secure where necessary
- K16 why waste containers should be made secure

Exit clean-room and remove personal protective clothing after clean-

Carry out and complete clean-room cleaning operations

You need to know and understand:

- K17 the instructions, procedures or guidelines for exiting clean-rooms and where or who to get these from
- K18 the instructions, procedures or guidelines for storing or disposing of personal protective clothing and where or who to get these from
- K19 which items of personal protective clothing require storage and which require disposal
- K20 what actions to take if any of the personal protective clothing is damaged and why it is important to take action in these circumstances
- K21 why it is important to follow laid down procedures for exiting clean-rooms
