#### Overview

This Standard is about essential safety awareness regulations when working in the Music and Sound Industries. It will encourage the importance of regular daily checks on facilities and equipment and how to maintain clean and tidy facilities and equipment. This standard is applicable to both a recording studio and a venue.

The correct safe working use of professional equipment and materials and the correct disposal of media waste safely and hygienically across both recording and live sectors. There are a number of regulations in place.

This standard will make you aware that developing positive personal attitudes to safety at work is important for the smooth running of any working environment. You must also be aware of the employer's duty to ensure that they and their staff make daily positive decisions to act and work responsibly and safely in order to protect themselves and other people in their work environment.
