Prepare for regulated surgical procedures on animals in a Home Office designated establishment



Overview

This standard covers preparing for regulated surgical procedures on animals in a Home Office designated establishment.

You will be required to prepare for surgical procedures by ensuring that the environment is clean and follow infection control procedures. Ensuring the required equipment and materials are available for use. You will ensure that environmental conditions are monitored as required such as light, temperature, noise. You must also prepare animals for the planned procedure by applying the appropriate method of restraint, carrying out the necessary pre-procedure activities and minimising stress.

You must also obtain accurate monitoring information from observations and measurements of vital signs.

This standard is for licensed animal technologists in Home Office designated establishments.

It is essential that you work strictly within the limits of both your personal licence and the relevant project licence.
