## Conduct regulated surgical procedures on animals in a Home Office designated establishment



#### **Overview**

This standard covers conducting regulated surgical procedures on animals in a Home Office designated establishment.

You must conduct regulated surgical procedures on animals correctly, effectively and with due regard for the welfare of the animal. The type of procedure(s) carried out will vary from situation to situation and from organisation to organisation.

You will be expected to handle tissues or organs and use surgical materials and equipment correctly including relevant anaesthetic equipment.

You will be expected to use different methods of anaesthesia which will include injected, topical and gaseous. You must also obtain accurate monitoring information from observations and measurements of vital signs.

This standard is for licensed animal technologists in Home Office designated establishments.

It is essential, that you work strictly within the limits of both your personal licence and the relevant project licence.

### Performance criteria

You must be able to:	P1	use safe practices and the appropriate personal protective equipment when carrying out scientific or technical activities
	P2	maintain appropriate levels of hygiene and bio-security
	P3	confirm the identity of the animal and the regulated surgical procedure to be undertaken against available information
	P4	confirm that all the required equipment and materials are available and in a fit state for use
	P5	conduct regulated surgical procedures promptly and effectively according to the requirements of the procedure and the condition of the animal
	P6	obtain monitoring information throughout the procedure and take the appropriate action where problems arise
	P7	handle the animal's tissues and organs according to the requirements of the procedure so as not to cause unnecessary damage or trauma
	P8	apply surgical materials at the correct location and in the correct manner
	P9	apply medication in the correct dosage and at the correct time
	P10	attach surgical equipment to the animal at the correct location and with minimal effect on tissue
	P11	correctly use surgical equipment and apply it at the correct time
	P12	deal with waste safely and correctly in accordance with legislation
	P13	keep accurate and up to date records as required by relevant legislation and the organisation
	P14	conduct all activities within the provision of your personal licence and the project licence
	P15	comply with legislation relating to the care and welfare of animals in a Home Office designated establishment
	P16	carry out all work in accordance with relevant environmental and health and safety legislation, risk assessment requirements, codes of practice and company policies
