

OverviewThis standard covers the preparation of animals and equipment for general
procedures in a Home Office designated establishment.You will be required to prepare for procedures by ensuring that the necessary
equipment and materials are available and in a fit state for use, restraining and
preparing the animal for the procedure and monitoring environmental
conditions, such as light, temperature, noise as required.You should have a good understanding why animals are used, and be
constantly reminded of mans obligation to them, and our responsibility for
ensuring their proper care and treatment at all times.This standard is for animal technologists or support staff who have
responsibility for preparing animals and equipment for general procedures in a
Home Office designated establishment.

Performance criteria

You must be able to:

P1 use safe practices and appropriate personal protective equipment when carrying out scientific or technical activities

- P2 maintain appropriate levels of hygiene and bio-security
- P3 assess the potential risks to health and safety in this area of work
- P4 select and confirm the identity of the animal according to the requirements of the general procedure
- P5 acclimatise the animal to the environment to reduce stress
- P6 handle and restrain the animal using suitable method(s) and prepare it according to instructions
- P7 select and prepare appropriate equipment necessary for the efficient conduct of the procedure
- P8 select, prepare and store appropriate materials required for the procedure
- P9 monitor the animal for potential adverse reactions and take appropriate action
- P10 take the necessary protective measures to prevent cross-infection or injury to the animal
- P11 monitor environmental conditions to suit the needs of the animal and the procedure being undertaken, and report any necessary adjustments to the appropriate person
- P12 confirm the completion of the correct preparation and conditioning
- P13 comply with legislation relating to the care and welfare of animals in a Home Office designated establishment
- P14 carry out all work in accordance with relevant environmental and health and safety legislation, risk assessment requirements, codes of practice and company policies
