LANAUX6 Assist with the provision of basic nursing care to animals



Overview

This standard covers assisting with the provision of basic nursing care to animals. Nursing care could include any of the following:

- 1. food and fluid intake
- 2. general observation and monitoring
- 3. replacing dressings and bandages
- 4. monitoring wounds
- 5. assisted feeding
- 6. monitored gastro-intestinal and urinary function
- 7. five freedoms' assessments
- 8. first aid

This standard is suitable for lay members of veterinary practice staff working under the direction of qualified veterinary staff.

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Performance criteria

You must be able to:

- P1 confirm the animal's condition and the level of nursing care required with a qualified member of veterinary practice staff
 - P2 confirm and obtain supplies of equipment and materials needed to carry out the required nursing care
 - P3 handle the animal in an appropriate way and keep it as calm and comfortable as possible
 - P4 administer basic nursing care according to the direction of qualified veterinary staff
 - P5 assisted qualified veterinary staff in the provision of first aid or emergency treatment if required
 - P6 monitor the progress of the animal being nursed by checking the following as required:
 - P6.1. vital signs
 - P6.2. mucous membranes
 - P6.3. normal body functions and behaviour
 - P6.4. appearance
 - P6.5. welfare needs
 - P7 alert a qualified member of veterinary staff to any problems with the animal or with the care being given
 - P8 complete records as required by the veterinary practice
 - P9 dispose of surplus and waste materials safely and correctly
 - P10 comply with health and safety regulations and guidelines at all times
 - P11 comply with animal welfare legislation at all times
