Plan and manage the harvesting of crops and post-harvest activities



Overview

This standard covers the planning and management of harvesting and post-harvest activities for crops including grass, root crops, arable crops, vegetables, herbs, flowers or fruit.

Post-harvest activities could include selection, cleaning, drying, prestorage treatments, grading, quality control, packing and labelling. The type of activities will depend on the crop, destination and market/customer requirements.

This standard is suitable for those who have responsibility for the planning and management of harvesting and post-harvest activities.

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Performance criteria

You must be able to:

- 1. identify the destination and the market/customer requirements of the crop
- plan and schedule the harvesting of the crop and post-harvest activities according to the destination and market/customer requirements
- 3. identify and confirm the availability of the resources required to implement the plan
- 4. communicate the plan to those involved with its implementation
- 5. establish measures to maintain the required levels of hygiene and bio-security and ensure that they have been implemented
- 6. establish measures for the recycling or disposal of waste and byproducts in accordance with relevant legal and organisational requirements, and confirm that they have been implemented
- confirm that working methods maintain health and safety and are consistent with relevant legislation, codes of practice and organisational requirements
- 8. confirm that those involved in the harvesting of crops and postharvest activities are using appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE)
- 9. manage the harvesting of the crop to confirm that it meets the destination and market/customer requirements
- 10. monitor the harvesting process and adapt plans accordingly, taking into account such things as changing conditions, weather, market requirements, etc.
- 11. manage the transportation of the crop from the field
- 12. manage post-harvest activities to meet storage or market/customer requirements
- 13. manage all harvesting and post-harvest activities to ensure that they meet the requirements for quality assurance
- 14. confirm that records are maintained and stored as required by relevant legislation, codes of practice, quality assurance requirements and organisational policies

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Knowledge and understanding

You need to know and understand:

- 1. the application of relevant harvesting standards
- 2. how to develop a management plan for harvesting and postharvest activities
- 3. how to determine the human, financial, material and capital resources necessary to achieve the plan
- 4. how the destination and market/customer requirements of the crop impact on the harvesting and post-harvesting activities
- 5. how the needs of crops differ in terms of harvesting, transport and post-harvest activities
- how market/customer requirements determine the methods of moving and transporting crops
- 7. the likely causes of deviations from plans and the impact of deviations on the harvesting of crops and post-harvest activities
- 8. the requirements for quality assurance
- 9. the methods of maintaining hygiene and bio-security and the reasons why this is important
- the relevant legal and organisational requirements for the handling, transport, storage and disposal of waste and byproducts
- 11. the opportunities for recycling, for example water, plant material
- 12. the importance of confirming that the correct personal protective equipment (PPE) is used by those harvesting crops and carrying out post-harvest activities
- 13. your responsibilities under relevant environmental, health and safety and food hygiene legislation, codes of practice and organisational requirements
- 14. the requirements for reporting and recording and the length of time for which records should be retained
