Prepare and operate small craft

You must be able to:	<ul> <li>Prepare for the operation of small craft</li> <li>1. carry out work safely in line with health and safety requirements</li> <li>2. confirm that craft is in a safe operating condition suitable for the work requirement</li> <li>3. confirm that propulsion and steering systems are in good working order suitable for the work</li> <li>4. check that all boat safety equipment is in good working order including personal protective equipment, survival equipment and communication equipment</li> <li>5. identify potential hazards, and take action to minimise risk during work activities</li> <li>6. report any situation which is seen to cause additional risks to planned operations</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Operate small craft</li> <li>7. manoeuvre craft in support of operations, taking account of prevailing environmental conditions</li> <li>8. complete all manoeuvres safely, staying within operating limits of craft, according to legal requirements</li> <li>9. take action to maintain vessel safety when operating problems are encountered,</li> <li>10. respond to man-over-board, manoeuvring craft to recover individual safely, according to recommended procedures</li> </ul>

- 12. the emergency procedures for 'man-over-board'
- 13. the dangers associated with immersion in water
