

Overview This standard is about being able to assist with cleaning and preparing traditional English leather horse harnesses for use. It includes being able to wash and apply saddlesoap and to polish selected parts of the harness as instructed. It includes being able to identify basic parts of the harness and to store harnesses as directed.

The work described in this standard would be carried out under the direction of a supervisor.

You will need to be fully aware of the importance of health and safety in connection with this work.

- K9 How to work in a way which maintains the safety of self and others
