

Overview
This standard involves being able to support the driver of a horse drawn vehicle whilst driving. It covers acting as an assistant to the driver during the drive, monitoring and reporting on the activities of traffic and other road users to the driver and taking appropriate action as instructed, and assisting with negotiating road junctions and maintaining control of the horse(s) when halted.
You will be able to adjust harness when appropriate. It involves being able to mount and dismount from the horse drawn vehicle whilst it is moving, and running ahead of the horse(s). You will be able to work with others as part of the driving crew.
The work described in this standard would be carried out following agreement of responsibilities with a supervisor.
You will need to be fully aware of the importance of animal health and welfare and health and safety in connection with this work.

You will need to be able to recognise hazards and assess risks within the workplace.

Performance criteria

You must be able to: P1 Establish your role and responsibilities in relation to this activity

- P2 Assist with carrying out routine pre-drive safety checks
 - P3 Assist the driver of the vehicle by monitoring and reporting on potential hazards which may affect the safe driving of the horses and vehicle
 - P4 Monitor the reactions of horses to objects and situations and report to the driver
 - P5 Mount and dismount the vehicle as appropriate during the drive
 - P6 Assist with negotiating road junctions and obstacles
 - P7 Carry out adjustments to the harness and vehicle whilst driving according to instructions
 - P8 Assist with maintaining control of horses whilst halted
 - P9 Check over and care for horses after use; report any areas of concern and take action to maintain the horse's welfare, as instructed
 - P10 Check over the harness and vehicle; report any areas of wear, tear or damage, and take action as instructed
 - P11 Maintain safety of self and others and the welfare of the horses at all times.
