You will need to be able to recognise hazards and assess risks within the workplace.

You must be able to:

- P1 Provide the horse with the appropriate care and welfare prior to the sale
- P2 Prepare the horse for sale according to instructions
- P3 Select, use and store appropriate equipment
- P4 Present the horse to prospective clients
- P5 Carry out appropriate post sale activities
- P6 Monitor and maintain the health and safety of horses, self and others during the work.

Knowledge and understanding

You need to know and understand:

- K1 The appropriate care and welfare required for horses prior to and post sale
- K2 The sales preparation procedures, including feeding, rugging, grooming, fitting equipment, plaiting and trimming
- K3 The use of training equipment and fitting specialist equipment for sales
- K4 Methods of presenting the horse to prospective clients
- K5 The importance of good manners in a horse and how to deal with any problems such as nipping or pulling away (leading)
- K6 Your responsibilities under relevant animal health and welfare and health and safety legislation/codes of practice.
