

Overview

This standard is for those who are managing and overseeing foaling and the rearing of young stock. It covers planning and implementing routine health care and monitoring the development of the young foal.

Performance criteria

- P1 Define and communicate team and individual responsibility and limits of authority
- P2 Supervise foaling care and care of the new born foal in accordance with agreed policy
- P3 Recognise foal and mare problems and take appropriate action
- P4 Obtain and act on feedback on the progress of the mare and foal
- P5 Plan and implement an appropriate diet for young stock to optimise growth and development
- P6 Review the health, growth, development and behaviour of young stock
- P7 Encourage individuals to make suggestions on how procedures could be improved.
