- K7 the advantages and disadvantages of closed flock and caught-up systems
- K8 how to assess the condition and health of gamebirds
- K9 the health and safety requirements associated with the handling of game bird stock and other wildlife species

Closed flock

A breeding stock which is maintained in captivity throughout its life
