Maintain game populations



Overview

This standard describes your role in maintaining game populations on a sporting estate. It relates to the work activities that you undertake to support game in the wild. This standard is aimed at those who work in game conservation on either a full- or part-time basis, and can be applied to any sporting estate.

To meet this standard you will be able to:

- prepare and maintain equipment to be used to provide food, water and other resources
- 2. apply resources to effectively maintain game populations
- 3. monitor and report on the reaction of game to resources

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Performance criteria

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- P1 carry out work safely in line with health and safety requirements
- P2 identify when and where additional resources are required to support game populations
- P3 select, prepare and maintain the sites, equipment and facilities used to distribute resources
- P4 apply resources effectively to support game with minimum wastage
- P5 work in a manner which minimises disturbance to habitat and wildlife
- P6 monitor and report on reaction of game to resources
- P7 report accurately on game welfare and resource usage

- K1 the welfare requirements of game including common game welfare problems
- K2 the types of resources used to maintain game welfare
- K3 how resources are applied to support game
- K4 why it is important to minimise the disturbance caused during the preparation of facilities
- K5 the equipment and facilities required to provide additional resources to game in their habitat
- K6 the expected reaction of game to resources
- K7 the legal restrictions on the allocation of additional resources
- K8 the medications used in the maintenance of game health
- K9 the health and safety requirements associated with the application of resources including lone working
