Assist in the production of game chicks



Overview

This standard describes your role in the production of game chicks. It relates to the work activities that you undertake to support the incubation and hatching of game eggs. This standard is aimed at those who work in game production on a full- or part-time basis, and can be applied to any sporting estate or game farm involved in the production of game chicks.

To meet this standard you will be able to:

- 1. load eggs into incubator
- 2. maintain game eggs in incubation
- 3. maintain the hatching process
- 4. unload game chicks from a hatcher

You must be able to:

Assist in incubation of game eggs

- P1 carry out work safely in line with health and safety requirements
- P2 establish incubator in a clean and hygienic condition
- P3 set eggs in the incubator according to manufacturer's instructions
- P4 establish environmental conditions within the incubator to facilitate successful incubation
- P5 candle eggs to confirm viability
- P6 take action to maintain required **environmental conditions**, within limits of authority
- P7 monitor incubation and report any **environmental conditions** which fall outside given specification
- P8 clean incubation facilities after use
- P9 maintain accurate records

You must be able to:

Assist with the hatching of game chicks

- P10 carry out work safely in line with health and safety requirements
- P11 transfer eggs to hatcher according to manufacturer's instructions
- P12 establish **environmental conditions** within the hatcher to facilitate a successful hatch
- P13 monitor hatching process and report any **environmental conditions** which fall outside of given specification
- P14 remove chicks from hatcher in a manner which maintains chick welfare and optimises survival
- P15 dispatch any sick or abnormal chicks according to approved codes
- P16 establish chicks safely and securely in a clean and well ventilated chick boxes
- P17 clean hatching facilities after use
- P18 dispose of waste and mortalities according to legal requirements
- P19 maintain accurate records
