Deliver non-surgical procedures to livestock



Overview

This standard covers the delivery of non-surgical procedures to livestock.

You will deliver non-surgical procedures to livestock, consistent with the legal requirements, such procedures should only be carried out on own livestock or the livestock of your employer.

When working with livestock or machinery you need to be appropriately trained in line with current legislation, and hold a relevant award where appropriate.

This standard is suitable for those involved in the delivery of non-surgical procedures to livestock.

	P5	use the correct practices and techniques to deliver non-surgical procedures required, and comply with any legislation requirements
	P6	restrain the animal securely and safely in a manner that needs your duty of care requirements under animal welfare legislation
	P7	minimise discomfort and promote good aftercare to livestock
	P8	observe animals after receiving non-surgical procedures and where appropriate report any unusual signs to the appropriate person
	P9	maintain suitable levels of hygiene and bio-security
	P10	ensure that environmental and health and safety policies and risk assessment requirements are put into practice across your area of responsibility
	P11	deal with waste safely and correctly in accordance with legislation
	P12	ensure appropriate records are completed as required by relevant
