- K8 who to request additional equipment from and why it is important to act quickly when extra equipment is requested

- K10 how to maintain sterility of equipment and materials and why it is important
- K11 the correct handling techniques for different parts of an animal's anatomy during surgery
- K12 the correct locations for the application of surgical materials
- K13 the principles of surgical site irrigation
- K14 the principles of topical applications of medication during surgery
- K15 how and where to connect to different types of surgical equipment during surgical procedures, including:
 - K15.1. instruments
 - K15.2. powered equipment

- K17 how to remove animals from surgical equipment and the correct times for doing so
- K18 your professional responsibilities as a registered veterinary nurse
