Prepare animals for anaesthesia



Overview

This standard is about preparing animals for anaesthesia. It covers ensuring the environmental conditions are suitable and adjusted as necessary.

This standard also covers the performance of pre-anaesthetic checks and procedures.

This standard is suitable for registered veterinary nurses.

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Performance criteria

- You must be able to:*
- P1 confirm the animal's condition, the preparation undertaken and the anaesthetic procedure being administered against available information
 - P2 adjust the environmental conditions to suit the needs of the animal
 - P3 position and restrain the animal carefully using suitable handling equipment and methods
 - P4 encourage the animal to feel at ease in the clinical environment
 - P5 perform pre-anaesthetic checks and procedures prior to pre-medication and induction
 - P6 monitor the animal carefully
 - P7 assess the potential risks to health and safety in this area of work
 - P8 comply with animal health and welfare legislation and codes of practice
 - P9 select and implement appropriate infection control procedures
 - P10 maintain your own professional conduct

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Knowledge and understanding

You need to know and understand:

- K1 the type of information that could be used to identify the condition of an animal and the anaesthetic procedures that are used
- K2 how to position and restrain different types of animal for different types of anaesthetic procedure
- K3 how to encourage animals to feel at ease in clinical environments
- K4 the pre-anaesthetic checks that should be undertaken and the different types of preparation needed to administer anaesthetics
- K5 the pre-medication checks that should be undertaken
- K6 how to monitor animals for different types of difficulties, including:
 - P6.1. injury
 - P6.2. distress
 - P6.3. clinical deterioration
- K7 the adjustments to environmental conditions needed for different types of animal, including
 - K7.1. light
 - K7.2. temperature
 - K7.3. ventilation
 - K7.4. noise
- K8 The principles and key points of relevant health and safety regulations and guidelines
- K9 appropriate infection control measures
- K10 your professional responsibilities as a registered veterinary nurse
- K11 your responsibilities for the health and welfare of animals under current legislation and codes of practice

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
