Overview

This standard is about managing the care for animals in accommodation. It covers ensuring that the accommodation is cleaned and prepared to suit the condition of the animal and monitoring the condition of animals in the accommodation. In carrying out this work you will be caring for animals during illness, recovery from surgical procedures and hospitalisation.

The work covered in this standard contributes to infection control and the prevention of transfer of infectious diseases to future occupants of the accommodation.

This standard is suitable for registered veterinary nurses.
