Prepare and maintain a safe working site for treework operations



Overview

This standard is about preparing and maintaining a safe working site for treework operations. The standard includes the safe preparation and maintenance of treework sites, supporting and assisting colleagues and the disposal of arisings.

Anyone involved in the positioning of warning signs on public highways needs to be supervised by a qualified person under relevant legislation.

Your work must conform to all relevant legislation and codes of practice when carrying out this work.





Performance criteria

You must be able to:

- 1. assess the risks associated with the site and the proposed work
- select and implement appropriate working methods in accordance with the assessed risks
- select and use the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) for the work
- 4. select, prepare and use the appropriate tools and equipment, safely and effectively
- 5. confirm all equipment has been checked and is fit for purpose
- 6. communicate effectively with all those involved throughout your work
- 7. prepare and lay out the work site for safe treework operations
- 8. implement the appropriate controls to maintain safe treework operations
- 9. implement environmental controls taking account of the assessment of the environmental impacts and aspects
- 10. maintain the safety and security of machinery and equipment on site
- 11. maintain the health and safety of yourself and others at all times, in accordance with relevant legislation





Knowledge and understanding

You need to know and understand:

- 1. how to identify hazards and assess risks
- 2. how to interpret risk assessments
- 3. the selection, use and care of personal protective equipment (PPE)
- 4. the types of tools and equipment required and how to maintain and use these safely and effectively in line with the manufacturer's recommendations
- 5. the legal requirements for checking equipment
- 6. the key elements of a method statement in relation to safe treework operations
- 7. how to prepare and lay out sites for safe and effective working
- the correct location and positioning of warning signs and access controls, and the legislative requirements and industry codes of practice governing these
- 9. how the species and condition of trees affects operations
- 10. the potential impact of your work on the environment and the environmental controls that can be used to minimise this
- 11. why it is important to maintain the safety and security of equipment and vehicles on site
- 12. your responsibilities under relevant environmental, health and safety legislation and codes of practice
