# Performance criteria

#### You must be able to:

- P1 assess the risks associated with the site and the proposed works
- P2 select and implement appropriate working methods in accordance with the assessed risks
- P3 select appropriate preparation methods in line with the specification and the site conditions
- P4 prepare the soil in line with the specification taking into account the weather and ground conditions
- P5 make effective use of the available resources
- P6 remove all waste and surplus materials and dispose of them as specified
- P7 select, prepare and use tools and equipment that are appropriate to the work, safely and effectively
- P8 maintain the security of machinery and equipment on site
- P9 follow organisational and industry environmental good practice and minimise environmental damage
- P10 maintain the health and safety of yourself and others at all times in accordance with current legislation

# Knowledge and understanding

You need to know and understand:

- K1 how to identify hazards and assess risks
- K2 how to interpret risk assessments
- K3 the emergency planning and procedures relevant to the site
- K4 the different **methods** of preparing sites for planting
- K5 how to interpret specifications and select appropriate preparation methods
- K6 the effects of site conditions on the selection of cultivation methods
- K7 how to deal with underground, ground and overhead obstructions
- K8 the types of tools and equipment required and how to maintain and use these safely and effectively
- K9 why it is important to maintain safety and security of equipment and vehicles when on site
- K10 the correct methods of disposing of surplus materials and/or waste
- K11 the potential impacts of your work on the environment and how these can be minimised
- K12 your responsibilities under current environmental, health and safety legislation and codes of practice
