## Undertake biopsy using a flexible cystoscope



#### **Overview**

This standard covers the use of a flexible cystoscope to take tissue samples from the inside of the bladder. It also covers requests for histopathology investigations and the initial handling of the tissue samples. This standard covers biopsy procedures using a flexible cystoscope for adults only. Paediatric services are excluded. Users of this standard will need to ensure that practice reflects up to date information and policies.

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# Performance criteria

#### You must be able to:

- P1 assess patient for contra-indications for biopsy
- P2 explain the intended procedure to the patient, its reason and purpose and the possible sensation during the procedure
- P3 check the location and availability of emergency equipment
- P4 prepare and introduce a diathermy compatible cystoscope into the urethra
- P5 recognise abnormal areas which need to be biopsied and seek advice when
- P6 maintain communications with the patient throughout the procedure and respond to any questions or needs
- P7 select appropriate biopsy forceps and check that they are in working order
- P8 insert biopsy forceps through the appropriate channel of the cystoscope and identify the forceps as they enter the bladder and field of vision
- P9 use the cystoscope controls to orientate the biopsy forceps over the tissue to be sampled
- P10 open the jaws of the forceps or instruct assistant to operate attachment controls to open jaws
- P11 take tissue sample ensuring sufficient tissue is grasped to provide an adequate specimen
- P12 withdraw forceps with attached tissue and deposit sample into appropriate fixative in a patient labelled sample container
- P13 clean forceps after discharging each sample before taking any further samples
- P14 visually check biopsy sites for obvious bleeding and take appropriate action
- P15 recognise the need for immediate management of acute emergencies associated with the procedure and respond appropriately
- P16 complete histopathology request form stating any previous histopathology, relevant clinical details and reasons for biopsy, noting and recording any landmarks to indicate the location of the area biopsied
- P17 document the outcome of the examination and record all biopsies taken
- P18 recognise when you need help and/or advice and seek this from appropriate sources
