## Identify, and respond to, risks relating to data and information in a health context



### Overview

This standard is about identifying and responding to risks relating to data and information in a health context. Risks may be in relation to obtaining, holding, recording, sharing and using information. Information may be categorised as person identifiable and non-person identifiable.

Users of this standard will need to ensure that practice reflects up to date information and policies.

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### Performance criteria

- P1 identify and evaluate potential risks to data and information
- P2 discuss potential risks relating to data and information with colleagues and relevant others within the context of your work
- P3 respond to risks to information in accordance with organisational and legislative
- P4 suggest changes to improve the ways in which risks are identified and addressed

*You need to know and understand:*

- K1 the relevant legislation, policies, procedures, codes of practice and guidelines in relation to obtaining, holding, recording, sharing and using data and information
- K2 the types of risks that exist, including risks in relation to obtaining, holding, recording, sharing and using data and information
- K3 the issues that exist around security of information and public access to information
- K4 how to identify risks, and the levels of risks, relating to data and information within the context of your work
