Identify the health information needs of staff, patients and the public to support the development of systems



Overview

This standard is about identifying the health information needs of staff, patients and the public to support the development of systems. It is relevant to individuals who are working with a variety of stakeholders to develop systems.

Users of this standard will need to ensure that practice reflects up to date information and policies.

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Performance criteria

You must be able to:

- P1 identify the stakeholders that need to be involved
- P2 identify the appropriate processes to use for involving stakeholders
- P3 conduct a dialogue with stakeholders to identify health information needs
- P4 discuss the potential benefits and risks associated with the health information needs
- P5 manage expectations effectively throughout the process
- P6 fully consider the risks and undesired consequences of the use of health
- P7 clearly document the outcomes of the work and make appropriate recommendations

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Knowledge and understanding

You need to know and understand:

- K1 the relevant legislation, policies, procedures, codes of practice and guidelines in relation to health information needs
- K2 the wider sensitivities of data, information and knowledge relevant to your role
- K3 the professional codes of ethics relevant to the areas of your work, including those of other professions you are working with
- K4 the health and business context for data, information and knowledge requirements
- K5 the importance of taking into account the accessibility of systems for those with special communication needs
- K6 your organisation's planning cycles and objectives
- K7 the health care delivery process in the area of work you are focussing your attention on
- K8 the importance of effective information governance including; confidentiality, consent, data protection, security and privacy
- K9 the different ways in which data, information and knowledge are used in healthcare
- K10 the relevant health information systems in your organisation
- K11 the current developments in the application of health information systems relevant to the areas of your work
- K12 the roles of staff responsible for maintaining and developing the technical aspects of health information systems
- K13 the ways in which staff and other users interact with health information systems
- K14 the reasons why there are limitations to what can be achieved with health information systems
- K15 how benefits realisation is a driver when identifying needs
- K16 the risks in relation to the use of health information systems
- K17 how to identify the health information needs of staff, patients and the public
- K18 how to identify and involve relevant stakeholders
- K19 how to interpret the needs and manage expectations of stakeholders
- K20 the processes for documenting the outcomes of the work and making recommendations
