

Overview This standard is for individuals working in public service. It is designed to ensure that individuals are able to carry out activities effectively to control damage on board a ship in line with the appropriate guidelines. It also ensures that individuals know how to identify and deal with secondary hazards in relation to conducting damage control activities.



Performance criteria

You must be able to:

- 1. follow organisational procedures at all times
- 2. maintain your own personal safety and the safety of others at all times
- 3. confirm and identify the nature of the damage
- 4. take action to control damage within the limits of your role and responsibilities
- 5. identify and address secondary hazards
- 6. preserve the integrity of compartments
- 7. report your findings to the appropriate person




Knowledge and understanding
