

Overview This standard is recommended for firefighters.

This standard is about your ability to maintain your organisation's readiness for operational response to fires and other incidents, either as an individual or as part of a team. You will need to collect and maintain information about risks and resources in your community. You will also be expected to test, maintain and commission equipment required for operational response, such as equipment in stations and equipment on fire and rescue vehicles.

- P14 inform relevant others when you identify shortages of resources and supplies needed for maintenance in line with your organisation's communication procedures

You must be able to: P15 operate safely within your agreed role, responsibility and level of expertise and in line with your organisation's health and safety procedures

- P16 keep accurate records and provide these to others in line with your organisation's requirements
- P17 work with others in ways that;
 - P17.1 encourages cooperation
 - P17.2 supports common understanding
 - P17.3 promotes a positive image of your organisation
- P18 return resources after use and make sure they are secured and stored in line with your organisation's procedures
