Establish objectives for initiatives and resources to address risks of offending



Overview

This standard is about establishing objectives and plans for your organisation. It covers initiatives and the use of resources to manage risks associated with offending/reoffending. These will be the context of and in line with your organisation's overall strategy and aims.

Target group

This standard is applicable to senior managers with responsibility for establishing their organisation's objectives in managing risks associated with offending/reoffending.

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Performance criteria

You must be able to:	
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- P1 establish an achievable vision which sets out what your organisation is seeking to achieve to manage the risks associated with offending/reoffending
- P2 identify and prioritise objectives to manage risk in the community which are consistent with your organisation's overall objectives and responsibilities
- P3 identify and justify a prioritisation of the target groups that your organisation wishes to address
- P4 develop and assess strategic options to achieve objectives
- P5 agree a strategy which builds on preferred options and sets out specific and relevant objectives
- P6 identify key performance measures, and methods for monitoring and evaluating the strategy
- P7 seek out opportunities to improve performance
- P8 identify the actions and resources required to implement the agreed strategy, within a timescale for undertaking the actions identified
- P9 balance the needs and expectations of key stakeholders and win their support
- P10 explore and assess the opportunity for possible partnerships and affiliations to achieve the strategies and objectives
- P11 delegate responsibility for achieving the strategic aims and allocate resources effectively
- P12 identify measures and methods for monitoring and evaluating the plan
- P13 communicate the strategy accurately to relevant people
