SFJJC101 Prepare and drive official vehicles



Overview

This standard is about preparing and driving official vehicles on the road network. It includes undertaking pre-use inspections of the vehicles, and also checking that the associated operational equipment is available which might include fire extinguishers, signs, cones and first-aid supplies. It also includes driving the vehicles safely, taking into account the road type and prevailing conditions.

This standard is intended primarily for non-emergency services where the driving of the vehicle and undertaking of associated manoeuvres is within laid down procedures.

It is a requirement of this standard that you also hold a current, full national driving licence.

Maintaining your own health and safety, and that of other road-users, is of paramount importance.

There are two elements:

- 1 Prepare official vehicles for use
- 2 Drive official vehicles safely

Performance criteria	Prep	are official vehicles for use
You must be able to:	P1	carry out a pre-use inspection of the vehicle, including the checking of tyres, brakes, fluid levels, lights, electrical and safety equipment, in line with legislative and your organisation's requirements
	P2	check the bodywork and cleanliness of the vehicle
	P3	identify any defects or damage to the vehicle and equipment, and address these promptly and correctly, reporting these to the appropriate person where necessary
	P4	identify any equipment that is missing, and address this promptly and correctly
	P5	ensure that any required operational equipment is available and in proper working order, addressing any problems promptly and correctly
	P6	ensure that you take out only those vehicles which have fulfilled inspection requirements
	P7	maintain accurate and complete documentation regarding inspections and associated preparations
	Drive	e official vehicles safely
You must be able to:	P8	drive official vehicles safely at all times and in accordance with the requirements of relevant legislation, the Highway Code and your organisation's procedures
	P9	drive at all times within the limits of the vehicle and your personal ability, whilst taking into account the type of road and the road surface, time of day, the volume of traffic including low and high volumes, visibility and weather conditions
	P10	conduct compliant vehicle manoeuvres safely, legally, and in line with your organisation's procedures
	P11	enter and exit observation points and service areas safely and correctly, where relevant
	P12	manoeuvre your vehicle, including parking and using speed, in a manner designed to achieve effective and safe traffic flow amongst other road- users
	P13	take all reasonable actions to maintain the health and safety of yourself and others whilst driving
	P14	are able to provide a justifiable rationale for your actions when driving the vehicle
	P15	recognise and respond correctly to fatigue, stress and any further factors which might impair your judgement, performance and decision-making while driving
	P16	identify and report correctly any defects or damage to your vehicle and equipment whilst these are in your control, in line with your organisation's

P17 maintain accurate and complete documentation in line with your organisation's requirements

	K9	the importance of taking into account the health and safety of yourself and others at all times during driving, and how to do this	
	K10	how to recognise and take account of fatigue, stress and other physical and psychological factors that might affect your judgement, performance and decision-making during driving	
	K11	the vehicle manoeuvres which are within your authority to undertake and how to carry these out safely and legally, including for example, entering and exiting the hard shoulder, entering and exiting observation points and service areas, and using `fend-off' techniques	
	K12	how and when to use safely slip-roads, link-roads and emergency exit points	
	K13	factors to take into account when driving on parts of the road network which are not being used by other road users, including where there is adjacent live traffic	
	K14	the risks associated with stopping on the bull-nose, and the limited circumstances when it might be appropriate to do this	
	K15	factors to take into account when driving on elevated road sections,
