Commission and oversee outsourced policy evaluation



Overview

Policy evaluation may be carried out by an external and independent team. The choice to take this approach will depend on a combination of a wish for independent review and resourcing issues. This unit covers the process of deciding who will undertake the evaluation, commissioning the work and overseeing the evaluation project.

Commission and oversee outsourced policy evaluation

- P1 specify the objectives and parameters of the project
- P2 identify the relative benefits and drawbacks of commissioning an independent party to undertake the evaluation
- P3 organise a selection process to identify the most appropriate independent party to undertake the project
- P4 negotiate final terms of reference and project plans with the independent party chosen for the project
- P5 agree project governance arrangements with the independent party
- P6 contribute to and support the project work of the independent policy evaluation team
- P7 apply project management methods to the evaluation project in consultation with the independent party
- P8 monitor the risks of the evaluation project
- P9 accept ownership of the policy evaluation process when the terms of reference of the independent evaluation team have been fulfilled
- P10 contribute to the decision-making process leading to plans for future policy
- P11 construct an action plan to move forward policy development plans

Knowledge and understanding

You need to know and understand:

- K1 specific legislation, regulation, governance and cultural requirements that relate to the nation or region to which the policy will apply
- K2 that the policy formation process involves continuous engagement and partnership with a range of stakeholders meaning that those in policy functions must coordinate and on occasions take the lead but must also constantly seek to ensure that there is full stakeholder engagement
- K3 how to write a project specification that defines clearly the outsourced services being sought
- K4 the possible advantages and disadvantages of outsourcing the evaluation project
- K5 organisational procedures for procuring outsourced services
- K6 why it is important to negotiate and agree final terms of reference and detailed project plans as early as possible in the project
- K7 the importance of formal governance arrangements for the benefit of all stakeholders in an outsourced policy evaluation
- K8 why it is important to play a limited contributory role in an outsourced evaluation process
- K9 project management methods that are appropriate to the size, scope and nature of the project
- K10 risk assessment techniques within project management
- K11 why it is important to formally accept ownership of the evaluation at an appropriate point before recommendations are accepted
- K12 why it is important to reach decisions on policy development within a reasonable timescale
- K13 how to create an action plan that includes Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, Time-bound (SMART) objectives

Focusing on results

 You take responsibility for agreeing an action plan that will move forward policy development.

6. You work in close partnership with those responsible for policy evaluation to ensure that recommendations and action plans match strategic objectives.
