Undertake needs assessments of victims and witnesses



#### **Overview**

This unit is about undertaking a needs assessment of victims and witnesses. It includes determining relevant circumstances, assessing the associated needs and making contact with the relevant agencies.

Note- where the text refers to `Victim Personal Statements' these are known as `Victim Personal Statements' in England, Wales and Northern Ireland and `Victim Statements' in Scotland.

#### There are three elements:

- 1 Determine relevant circumstances and identify associated needs
- 2 Provide reassurance to victims and witnesses
- 3 Make contact with relevant agencies

#### **Target Group**

This unit is for Witness Care Officers and others whose responsibilities include undertaking needs assessments of victims and witnesses in preparation for their appearing in court.

You must be able to:	P9	use appropriate communication techniques and seek to put the witness at their ease
	P10 P11	maintain flexibility in response to the witness' behaviour and attitude encourage questions, check for understanding, and provide clarification where necessary
	P12	explain clearly and accurately to the witness the next steps in the process and how they might contact you if they have any questions, or
	P13	require further support deal with individuals in an ethical manner, recognising their needs with respect to race, diversity and human rights

- P18 **document** fully all **relevant details** in accordance with current policy and legislation
