#### **Overview**

This unit describes the role of Board members in reviewing the overall risk portfolio for the organisation, agreeing the role of the Board in managing risk and taking responsibility for the risk management process

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# Performance criteria

#### Review the overall portfolio of risk for the organisation

#### You must be able to:

- P1 identify the range of risks and challenges that may impact on the overall survival of the organisation and its reputation
- P2 analyse the range of risks and challenges that may impact on the organisation and its ability to achieve its goals including the potential impact of multiple risks
- P3 review the organisation's risk management policy and internal control systems and agree responsibilities for risk management including those where the Board should take responsibility
- P4 analyse and agree the potential impact that risks may have on each other
- P5 agree and implement processes and procedures for the regular review of risk, the risk management process and internal control systems and the protocols that the Board need to put in place to ensure the appropriate action planning to address the risks
- P6 agree and implement processes and procedures for ensuring that key stakeholders are assured of the effectiveness of the risk management processes and internal control systems

# Take responsibility for the ongoing monitoring of the risk management process

#### You must be able to:

- P7 analyse and review the ways in which organisational risks are being addressed and propose any amendments
- P8 ensure the appropriate allocation of resources to the Executive to enable the implementation of an effective risk management process
- P9 review any legislative, environmental or political initiatives and developments that may impact on the organisation and build into the risk assessment process
- P10 promote an organisational culture which encourages an awareness of risk but balances that against the need to take acceptable risks

# Knowledge and understanding

#### Review the overall portfolio of risk for the organisation

## You need to know and understand:

- K1 the kinds of risks that may impact on organisation performance
- K2 ways in which risks may interact and how that can impact on their effect
- K3 those risks for which, in the light of Board responsibility and the agreed scheme of delegation to the Executive, the Board should take responsibility
- K4 why it is important to consider the potential impact on the organisation of multiple risks happening at the same time
- K5 the importance of Board commitment to risk management
- K6 the organisation's attitude to risk and opportunities that may arise from taking risks
- K7 processes and procedures for developing a risk assessment and management policy including contingency planning

# Take responsibility for the ongoing monitoring of the risk management process

# You need to know and understand:

- K8 current and emerging legislation, and political or environmental initiatives that may impact on the organisation
- K9 ways of developing a risk aware culture across the organisation and why it is important to balance this with an ability to take acceptable risk
- K10 what constitutes acceptable risk
