cultivate and harvest crops.You will be responsible for preparing agricultural and land-based horse drawn
implements and equipment for use, and maintaining and storing after use.You will be responsible for preparing horses for use, managing their welfare
during work, and caring for them after use. The standard includes knowing how
to maintain and operate horse drawn agricultural and land-based implements
and equipment correctly and safely. It involves being able to supervise others
assisting with using horses to cultivate and harvest crops.The standard includes being able to manoeuvre horse drawn agricultural and
land-based implements and equipment into position for use, and to remove and
store after use.This standard is suitable for anyone who uses horses to carry out agricultural
work.

	P2	select suitable harnesses and horses for the intended agricultural work
	P3	carry out routine pre-use checks of horses to ensure they are fit for work and trained for the intended task

	P5	carry out routine pre-use checks of harnesses and
		implements/equipment for fitness for purpose
	P6	hitch the horses to the implement, and work the horses, implement and equipment correctly for the intended agricultural work
	P7	monitor the well-being of the horses during and after work, and take action to promote their well-being
	P8	monitor the operation of the implement and equipment during work, and take action to maintain it in working order
	P9	ensure the horse and equipment/implement are cared for after work
	P10	evaluate the effectiveness of the work
	P11	work in a way which maintains the health and safety of self and others and the welfare of the horses
	P12	implement legislative requirements, codes of practice and other relevant legislation relating to the activities.

	K10	measures to eliminate or minimise stress or poor health in the horse

	K12	how to recognise signs of wear, tear or damage to the harness, implements and equipment
	K13	how to carry out routine maintenance before, during and after use
	K14	how to supervise others whilst working
	K15	how to prepare land, remove unwanted vegetation, plant, cultivate and harvest crops
	K16	the implications of using horses to manage land and cultivate crops in terms of environment, sustainability, specialist crop production, heritage and culture of the countryside
	K17	how to dispose of waste responsibly
	K18	how to work in a manner which maintains the health and safely of self and others and the welfare of the horses.
