#### LANLP13 Prepare to shear livestock



# Overview This standard covers the preparation to shear livestock. The standard covers sheep, camelids and goats. The standard involves preparing the work area and the livestock for shearing.

Throughout the procedure the welfare and general well-being of the livestock must be maintained.

When working with livestock or machinery you need to be appropriately trained in line with current legislation, and hold a relevant award where appropriate.

This standard is suitable for those involved in the preparation to shear livestock.

## Performance criteria

You must be able to: P1 assess the risks associated with the site and the preparation of livestock for shearing

- P2 ensure the work area is safe, clean and suitable for shearing
- P3 select, prepare and use tools, equipment and materials that are appropriate to the work safely and effectively
- P4 gather livestock awaiting shearing safely and in the appropriate numbers, in a suitable waiting area
- P5 maintain suitable levels of hygiene and bio-security
- P6 ensure where necessary sheep handling systems are prepared and appropriate for shearing
- P7 maintain the welfare and general well-being of the livestock at all times
- P8 ensure livestock are dry, free of dirt and debris, and suitable for shearing
- P9 correctly identify and deal with livestock which are unsuitable for shearing
- P10 ensure appropriate wool storage facilities are available for the intended quantity of wool
- P11 carry out all work in accordance with relevant environmental, health and safety legislation and animal health and welfare legislation, risk assessment requirements, codes of practice and company policies
- P12 maintain effective communication with colleagues and others involved in, or affected by the work
