Monitor and maintain the incubation of eggs



Overview

This standard covers the monitoring and maintenance of the incubation of eggs in hatchery production. The system could be manual or mechanical.

The standard covers the overall responsibility for this part of production.

When working with livestock or machinery you need to be appropriately trained in line with current legislation, and hold a relevant award where appropriate.

This standard is suitable for those involved in monitoring and maintaining the incubation of eggs.

	P8	check egg fertility at the correct intervals and the take appropriate action based on the correct interpretation of results
	P9	ensure eggs are selected for transfer and hatching in accordance with production requirements
	P10	monitor and maintain the hygiene and bio-security of the working environment in accordance with the required hygiene standards
	P11	ensure appropriate records are maintained and stored as required by relevant legislation and the organisation
	P12	carry out all work in accordance with relevant environmental, health and safety legislation and animal health and welfare legislation, risk assessment requirements, codes of practice and company policies
	P13	manage waste safely and correctly in accordance with legislation
	P14	maintain effective communication with colleagues and others involved or affected by the work
